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With degrees in chemical engineering and law, Mr. Coddington is an attorney with broad corporate, litigation and regulatory experience in private practice and Academia. He currently is a Professor of Practice at the College of Law at the University of Wyoming (UW) and serves as the faculty director for the: (1) Energy, Environmental and Natural Resources Law Clinic; and (2) Externship Program. He previously served in various roles at UW's School of Energy Resources.

Before moving to Wyoming in 2015 he practiced law in Washington, D.C. with international Big Law firms (Covington & Burling LLP; Ropes & Gray LLP; Alston & Bird LLP), with a focus on environmental and energy law. For Alston & Bird he relocated to London to launch a Kyoto Protocol carbon markets practice. Thereafter, he co-founded a boutique energy and environmental law firm, then led its Washington, D.C. office.

He is an internationally recognized expert in carbon capture, utilization and storage. He also is an expert in voluntary and regulated carbon markets. He co-founded and led the North American Carbon Capture & Storage Association. He was the Convenor of the International Organization for Standardization's committee that published the first technical standard for the geologic storage of carbon dioxide during enhanced hydrocarbon recovery operations.

He has testified before Congress and state legislative bodies; advised governments, companies and non-profits; and served as an expert witness.
