

**2021-2022 University of Wyoming Block Transfer with earned Qualifying Transfer Associate Degree  
from a Wyoming Community College for a  
Bachelor of Arts degree with a major in Gender & Women's Studies**

This Block Transfer has been written for students who have earned a qualifying transfer associate degree (*Associate of Arts (AA), Associate of Science (AS), Associate of Business (AB), and the Associate Degree in Nursing (ADN)*) with a minimum of sixty (60) credits in any major from one of the Wyoming Community Colleges (WYCC) who wish to complete the Bachelor of Arts with a major in Gender and Women's Studies. The UW degree program relies on the foundational coursework completed for the associate degree to prepare the student for baccalaureate-level study. All courses in this document are 3 credits unless otherwise noted.

**COLOR CODE:** Courses in **GREEN** may be taken at the community college or at UW; courses in **GOLD** must be taken at UW.

**BLOCK 1: Lower Division University Studies Program (USP) Requirements**

Courses taken to satisfy General Education requirements at the WYCCs are considered essential to prepare the student for entry into the Bachelor of Arts degree program at UW. Because of the quality of that foundation, students entering UW as of Fall 2001 are awarded the lower division general education requirements included in the USP (*students must select a US & Wyoming Constitutions course at the WYCC that will transfer to UW as USP:V*). Students transferring with a qualifying associate degree that was earned as a concurrently enrolled high school student will be required to take a First Year Seminar course at UW with a minimum grade of C. **BLOCK 2: Lower Division Required Courses**

Students may take these courses at the community colleges or at the University of Wyoming. If a course is not offered at your community college, you may take it at another community college or you may take it at UW. If the student does not satisfy these requirements prior to transferring, the requirement must be completed at UW.

**BLOCK 3: Gender & Women's Studies Requirements**

**Gender & Women's Studies Major Requirements:**

- All courses must be completed with a grade of "C" or better.

**University of Wyoming Requirements:**

- Total minimum credits required (including transfer credit) is 120 credits.
- Minimum cumulative GPA is 2.00.
- Students must complete 42 hours of upper division (3000-level or above) coursework, 30 of which must be taken in residence at UW.
- Students may not take a course for S/U credit to satisfy any requirement unless the course is offered for S/U credit only. ([Click here for UW's S/U transfer grade policy statement for spring 2020.](#))
- A grade of C or above is required for University Studies Program (USP) categories: FYS, C1, C2, and C3.
- No more than 4 credits of physical activity coursework may be applied to the minimum credit hour requirement for UW baccalaureate degree.
- The UW Office of the Registrar provides final approval of degree completion requirements prior to the awarding of any degree.

<b>Free Electives</b> <b>21 credits</b>	Students are encouraged to take courses that are history-based, global, and that address sexuality, ethnicity, and identity. Students may select from one of the following areas or may create an independent path with the assistance of a faculty mentor. Possible areas of study are: <u>Culture &amp; Representation</u> , <u>Science</u> , <u>The Body &amp; Sexualities</u> , <u>Social Policy &amp; Social Justice</u> , and <u>Independent Path</u> <i>(see your mentor to make a plan)</i> .	Students with a minimum GPA of 3.300 have the option of pursuing internships ( <a href="#">GWST 4970</a> ) to apply to their Free Elective credit requirement. Work with your faculty mentor to discuss your options and placement.

#### BLOCK 4: Credits Needed to earn 120 credits

In addition to the courses that are specifically required for the program, courses that transfer as "Electives" will count toward the 120 credits needed. Some students may need to take additional credits to earn a total of 120 credits. The number of credits needed (if any) will vary by student, and students should select courses to ensure that they satisfy residency requirements and upper division credit requirements.

#### HONORS Program in Gender & Women's Studies

Honors in Gender & Women's Studies recognizes academically ambitious students who have excelled in their undergraduate careers, and who are ready for graduate school and/or employment in the public or private spheres. Requirements include:

- Overall minimum GPA of 3.500 *and*
- Completion of GWST 4965 – Senior Honors Project *and*
- Completion of:
  - 3 semesters of foreign language *or*
  - 3 semesters of sign language *or*
  - A concentration in quantitative analysis & research methods, including Statistics
