Associate Professor Professor Du's (Ph.D., Iowa State University, 2001) responsibilities include performing research in muscle biology and meat science, teaching and advising of undergraduate and graduate students in Animal Science, and providing professional services. His research is focused on the molecular mechanisms controlling skeletal muscle growth and meat quality, especially fetal skeletal muscle growth and development. He has established a competitive research program in Muscle Biology and Meat Science as manifested by four USDA-NRI awards and one NIH R03 award as the principal investigator received during his tenure at UW. He has published more than seventy peer-reviewed publications and sixty meeting abstracts and invited speeches.

Surovell, Todd A.

Professor Surovell (Ph.D., University of Arizona, Tucson, 2003) was appointed to the Anthropology faculty in 2003. An expert in the ancient peoples of this region, Dr. Surovell is known for applying quantitative modeling to the archaeological record. He has a book "Toward a Behavioral Ecology of Lithic Technology" (University of Arizona Press) coming out this year as well as a variety of articles in such publications as the Proceedings of the National Academic of Sciences and Geoarchaeology.
